GPEN is delighted that Professor Graham Greenleaf has agreed to demonstrate this key tool for both legal privacy research and dissemination of case reports of privacy enforcement authorities. Graham is equally well known for his scholarship and advocacy in both privacy and the free access to law circles. This was reflected when in 2010 he was made a member of the Order of Australia (AM) for his contributions to advancing free access to legal information, and to the protection of privacy

The World Legal Information Institute's International Privacy Law Library contains the largest freely accessible and searchable collection of privacy law materials in the world. The library enables online searches over more than 30 specialised privacy law databases, as well as incorporating search results of privacy cases and other resources from numerous other databases of general court cases, legal articles and legislation. The library is being constantly updated through the network of legal information institutes cooperating with WorldLII. The library has existed for more than a decade but a recent grant allows it to add significant new materials from around the world to the collection.
