Reporting requirements notice:

Approved information sharing agreement between Accident Compensation Corporation, the Department of Internal Affairs, Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment, Ministry of Education, Ministry of Social Development, New Zealand Transport Agency, the Registrar of Motor Vehicles, the Registrar-General and the Road User Chargers Collector.

I am writing to formalise updates to the reporting requirements for the approved information sharing agreement (AISA) between Accident Compensation Corporation (ACC), the Department of Internal Affairs (DIA), Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE), Ministry of Education (MoE), Ministry of Social Development (MSD), New Zealand Transport Agency (NZTA), the Registrar of Motor Vehicles, the Registrar-General and the Road User Chargers Collector (the RUC) (the Customer Nominated Services AISA). The AISA relates to the supply of personal information to assist with the provision of public services that the individual has chosen to apply for where the service is:

- supported by the identity information held by DIA or the Registrar-General;
- provided by DIA; or
- provided by the Registrar-General.

The updates to the reporting requirements are outlined in Schedule D.

Part 7 of the Privacy Act 2020 and the Privacy Regulations 2020 set out the details that I can require DIA to report on. I have considered the cost of reporting, the degree of public interest

in the sharing arrangement and the impact on the individuals' privacy. The attached reporting metrics are designed to support an assessment of whether the AISA is achieving its objectives.

This reporting requirement notice will be modified as further Customer Nominated Services related processes are implemented by DIA. This letter and the notice will be published on our website as an important transparency measure.
