Privacy Good Research Fund

June 2015: Launched with \$75,000 seeking to:

- capitalise on existing privacy research capacity in academic and non-profit sectors
- generate new knowledge and support the development of privacy expertise
- increase NZ privacy awareness and understanding
- promote uptake and application of research results by relevant stakeholders.

First round fairly open-ended with encouragement for projects to assist with 'making privacy easy' for agencies or individuals or to contribute to 'Better Public Services'

November 2015: 4 projects approved for funding

Mid-2016 onwards: projects gradually completing, announced by researchers themselves, OPC blogging on each from late 2016

December 2016: OPC Privacy Research Symposium to disseminate results
