Learning from cyberattacks without compromising privacy

CERT NZ is a government national cyber security unit launched in April 2017. CERT NZ works at all levels of the economy, supporting businesses, organisations and everyday New Zealanders who are affected (or may be affected) by cyber security incidents.

Because CERT NZ deals with personal information from the people and organisations who report incidents, privacy is a core consideration. How it uses that information to help New Zealanders better protect themselves against cyber security threats while also maintaining their privacy, is also a core part of its role.

Katie Wellington, Manager of Engagement and Communications at CERT NZ will talk us through how it deals with the privacy of the data it collects, and how it uses that data to educate. Katie will talk about real life trends and issues CERT NZ is seeing in the landscape that affect the privacy of people's information.
